The Bipartisan Policy Center in Washington, D.C. asks Delcan Corporation to Develop Measures of Performance for Transportation Programs

Washington, D.C., January 6, 2010 — The Bipartisan Policy Center (BPC) in Washington, D.C. asked Delcan Corporation to conduct research for The National Transportation Policy Project. In this initiative, BPC is recommending bold and comprehensive reform on U.S. transportation policy, based on performance-driven goals to achieve better accountability.

The report entitled “Performance Metrics for the Evaluation of Transportation Programs” was written by Dr. Richard Mudge, Vice-President of Delcan’s Infrastructure Business National Operations, and Senior Associate, Keith Jasper.
